**CALL FOR PAPERS**

**Open Issue**

Due to the increasing submission of articles that deal with topics not necessarily related to the forthcoming issues of the journal, we would like to offer contributors the opportunity to publish papers in an “open” form; the only restriction being that they promote an interdisciplinary perspective towards Mexico. We also want to encourage authors – especially those who haven’t written the article yet, and those who are in the process of writing or already close to completion – to send us an abstract of the article (together with the planned delivery date), so that they can be incorporated into future issues.

This entails that – in the case of approval of the editorial board – a fixed date of publication cannot be guaranteed due to fact that we will continue with this journal’s standard format of publishing fixed thematic issues. To ensure the visibility and transparency of the journal and to offer a clear and direct form of communication with the authors, we commit ourselves to communicate the date of publication as soon as possible and directly to the authors.

Of course, the editorial standard and process will remain the same as with the form of a thematic issue (double blind review), therefore:

The articles, written in Spanish or in English, can be submitted via email, in Microsoft Word 97-2004 format (Times New Roman, 12pts., double-spaced), following MLA style (8th edition), to the following email address:

As a rule, the articles should be unpublished originals and not under consideration of other journal. Manuscripts must have an extension of 15 to 18 pages (notes and bibliography included), approximately 5,000 to 6,000 words. They must be accompanied by a 200-word abstract as well as a 10-line bio including academic appointment, research areas, recent publications, and 5 keywords to identify the content of the article.

The abstracts (for articles that aren't finished yet) must have an extension of 500 to 700 words (without counting the notes and the bibliography). They must be accompanied by a 10-line bio including academic appointment, research area and recent publications. In addition, a date for the finalization of the manuscript is required to incorporate it into the revision and editorial process. You can add 5 keywords to identify the content of the article.
